Lilydale Heights College is well recognised for its successful adoption of new technologies. We live a long way from the college and my child will need to travel by bus to school. Will this be a problem?

A large percentage of students catch the bus to and from the College each day. The bus network to our College reaches many areas of Lilydale and the Yarra Valley.

Our helpful staff supervise the bus shelter both before and after school. Early in Term 1, Year 7 teachers escort students to the bus shelter, assisting them to catch their allocated bus.

My child was a school captain at primary school. Will there be any opportunities for leadership at secondary school?

We realise our students come to secondary school with many talents and abilities. We want to harness the potential our students have and provide them with opportunities to develop their strengths.

In the past our student leaders have shown increased confidence, highly developed communication skills, greater independence as well as the ability to undertake responsibility and work with others. Leadership roles include: Student Representative Council, College Captains, Prefects, Music and Sports Captains, Student Representatives on College Curriculum and Planning committees.

By giving our students responsibilities we believe they will strive to achieve their best, demonstrating positive interpersonal skills and leadership of their peers.

I have heard that Lilydale Heights College has had some great successes in music. My child has an interest in music and might like to pursue this further. How can my child get involved?

Lilydale Heights College is well recognised for its highly successful musi program. Each year our College bands compete in state and national competitions, earning prestigious awards.

Students entering Year 7 may elect to take part in the Music Enrichment class, in which each student plays a musical instrument. These students lea and play together as an ensemble, taking part in weekly rehearsals, camp and performances.

The Music Enrichment class consists of a group of like-minded students, all of whom learn musical instruments and play in a band together. No experience is necessary to apply for this class.

All Year 7 students have the option of accessing music tuition in a range instruments. This is offered during class time.

My child is keen to play sport. What opportunities will there be to participate in sporting activities?

Every student has the opportunity to take part in Sport Education in Years 7-12. This includes the annual Athletics, Swimming and Cross Country carnivals. Regardless of ability, our students are encouraged to participate in various sports and compete in interschool competitions. Our College is one of the few that offers a Sport Education Program whereby students in Year 7 and 8 train for their chosen sports once a week.

A diverse range of sports are offered which may include teams in Basketball, Netball, Volleyball, Badminton, Table Tennis, Softball, Football, Cricket, Soccer, Hockey, Baseball and Tennis.

Are there activities outside regular classes our child can choose to take part in?

At Lilydale Heights College we recognise that learning takes place both inside and outside the classroom. Our Year 7 students regularly take part in activities beyond the classroom. These help our students to develop their self-esteem, communication skills and relationships with others.

At Lilydale Heights College we are proud of the way our students settle in and 'feel at home' so quickly. We recognise that commencing secondary school is a big step for both students and their parents and we actively set in place programs to support a smooth transition. We provide our Year 7s with many opportunities to develop comfortable relationships with their teachers and peers.

With teacher visits to the primary school, opportunities for orientation day viss and school tours for both students and parents, we do our best to ensure hat each child has a comfortable and positive start.

Our well-developed Peer Support Program helps our Year 7 students to quickly build trusting relationships with one another and with older students at the College.

Learning Leader

The Learning Leader has overall responsibility for student wellbeing and curriciulum programs ensuring that students are progressing in their studies.

Student Liaison

The Student Liaison is responsible for supporting the pastoral program and monitoring student progress and wellbeing.

SELF Teachers

Each Year 7 Form has a SELF (Student Engagment in Learning for the Future) teacher. This teacher meets with them throughout the week and assists students in their transition.

They are the contact person for the students and parents throughout the year.

Secondary schools seem so large compared to primary school. How will my child find their way around and feel welcome and safe?

To assist students with settling in and getting to know their teachers and peers, all our Year 7 classrooms are located in the Year 7 Area.

This area also houses the Year 7 teachers' office, all Year 7 student lockers and facilities. This designated Year 7 Area enables students to quickly feel confident in familiar surroundings and gradually work towards independence.

Students at Lilydale Heights quickly become familiar with their environment and develop a sense of pride in their school. Year 7 students spend the majority of their class time with their allocated Form Group in a Form Room; this becomes a space they feel very comfortable in and can take ownership of. Some specialist subjects are taught in other classrooms across the College, making great use of our extensive facilities. Initially Year 7 teachers escort the students to their classrooms, until they are comfortable making their own way there.

My child is excited about the range of subjects studied at secondary school. What subjects are studied in Year 7?

Year 7 is an exciting time when many new subjects are discovered. Year 7 students develop firm foundations in literacy and numeracy whilst exploring a wide range of subjects. Across Year 7 and 8 all students will undertake the following subjects:

If our child requires extra extension or learning support, what can the College offer?

Lilydale Heights College offers access to academic extension for all students working beyond their expected level. The College has all students undertake a range of diagnostic assessments early in the school year. This assessment assists staff in determining the explicit learning needs of your child. In this way students can be directly challenged with tasks which meet their academic level or supported in meeting their learning outcomes.

The Middle School (Years 9 and 10) vertical program allows eligible students access to studies up to two years ahead of their expected level. This includes access to VCE studies where suitable.

Quicksmart Numeracy and Literacy support may be offered to students who require additional support. These students work to improve their basic numeracy and literacy skills by receiving additional time with a trained instructor.
